










































Earlier this semester H23 were learning about their feelings and ways to regulate them as they met the Kimochis characters. The students in H23 were very excited to get to make their own Kimochis characters to take home, each with a Kotowaza (a wise saying):


I had the pleasure of finishing off the year running the Kimochis Program with M10 and M1.
